MISSION & HISTORY

Rochester Hope for Pets' mission is threefold: improving the quality of life for Rochester area companion animals by providing grants for veterinary care to pets whose owners are in times of need; assisting veterinary health teams with continuing education, research and new technology for the advancement of companion animal care; and providing support to animal-related nonprofit organizations whose missions support homeless animals in need.

In 2008, a Jack Russell Terrier was picked up by animal control in Rochester, NY. Despite her poor condition, the little terrier's spunk and vigor inspired the veterinarians and staff at the Animal Hospital of Pittsford, who donated the care and services needed to heal the dog and give her a second chance at life. The hospital staff dubbed the little dog "Hope," and helped her find a home once she was healthy. Her success story inspired the shareholders of Monroe Veterinary Associates to envision an organization that could assist other pets in the Rochester area. This vision was realized with the creation of the MVA Hope Foundation in 2008. In 2012, the organization was renamed Rochester Hope for Pets.

Connoris Story

Connot was a 6 month old fomsky. He was full of energy and not quite ready to listen to his mom just yet.

One mouning in October, he got away from his mom and was tragically struck by a hit and run driver. It was all caught on a ring camera. The miracle workers at VSES and Orchard Park Veterinary Clinic all worked together to save Connor's life. With funds from Milly's Mission and RHFP. Connor was able to get the care he needed, and now he's living his best life!

MILLY'S MISSION FOR LIFE SAVING SERVICES FOR DOGS


