Nicknamed the "tiny ambassador" who always helped his mom welcome new fosters to their "tiny tot ward" in her bedroom. Ponny was honored to support Rochester Hope for Pets and help raise money for other animals in need. He proudly attended the gala before crossing the Rainbow Bridge on Pecember 21. 2023 following his battle with stomach cancer. ### MISSION & HISTORY

Rochester Hope for Pets' mission is threefold: improving the quality of life for Rochester area companion animals by providing grants for veterinary care to pets whose owners are in times of need; assisting veterinary health teams with continuing education, research and new technology for the advancement of companion animal care; and providing support to animal-related nonprofit organizations whose missions support homeless animals in need.

In 2008, a Jack Russell Terrier was picked up by animal control in Rochester, NY, Despite her poor condition, the little terrier's spunk and vigor inspired the veterinarians and staff at the Animal Hospital of Pittsford, who donated the care and services needed to heal the dog and give her a second chance at life. The hospital staff dubbed the little dog "Hope," and helped her find a home once she was healthy. Her success story inspired the shareholders of Monroe Veterinary Associates to envision an organization that could assist other pets in the Rochester area. This vision was realized with the creation of the MVA Hope Foundation in 2008. In 2012, the organization was renamed **Rochester Hope for Pets.**

Right before his 2nd birthday. he was left with life threatening injuries after a hit and ryn. 10 days in the ICU, myltiple surgeries and 4 months later byke is getting back to "normal life"! His favorite things are going for walks and playing with the sprinkler! Dyke wouldn't be here if it wasn't for an amazing community and Rochester Hope for Pets. who generously donated to byke's astronomical bill. We hope to raise a lot in honor of byke to show our appreciation!


